County of Whitfield } On this 18th day of February
A.D. One thousand Eight Hundred and fifty
four, Before me the undersigned one of the
Justices of the Inferior Court in and for the
County and State aforesaid. Personally appeared
Wily D. Morgan aged 60 years, a Resident of the
County of Whitfield in the State of Georgia, who
being cautioned and then sworn in due form
of Law, declares on oath that he is the son
and Heir of Orman Morgan who was a Rev-
olutionary Soldier of the State of North Carolina
and who is now dead, that he died on or about
the 12th day of November A.D. 1829. And that his Mother
named Pally Morgan died on or about the
30th day of April A.D. 1838 And that they were
Married in the State of North Carolina on
or about the 1st day of September A.D. 1779,
Deponent further States that he has heard his
Father say that he served Six years in said War,
as a Continental Soldier and continued in actual
Service until the Close of the Revolutionary War,
and Deponent further declares that he has seen
his Father's Certificate of discharge, but that the
same was destroyed by fire and that he never
Received any Pension Money nor made any prec-

due me as Son and Heir of Orman Morgan a
Revolutionary Soldier of the State of North Carolina
and who died leaving the same undrawn, as
in Right of Custom Law or Equity he is or
may be entitled
